



Stockinette Stitch Roll Brim Hat and Ribbed Scarf

Skill level Intermediate

Techniques used: following a stitch pattern, knitting in the round with circular and double point needles and decreasing.

Size

Approximately 23" circumference for hat
Approximately 4" wide, 56" long for scarf

Materials

- "Lamb's Pride Worsted" by Brown Sheep Co, Inc. 85% wool, 15% mohair, (190 yds/100 g). **2 skeins**
- **Size US 8 (5.00 mm) circular and double point needles for hat, straights for scarf** (or size needed to obtain gauge.)
- **Stitch markers**
- **Tapestry needle**

Gauge

15 sts and 24 rows = 4" (10cm) for stockinette stitch.
28 sts and 19 rows = 4" (10cm) for rib stitch.

Abbreviations used in this pattern

Approx: approximately

Dec: decrease

K or k: knit

K2tog: knit 2 together

P or p: purl

Rep: repeat

Hat

With circular needles, cast on 90 sts, place a marker and join round being careful not to twist the stitches. Knit (K) in stockinette stitch for approximately 6 to 8", depending on how long you'd like the hat to be. At beginning of next round:

Shape crown:

Dec round: *K8, k2 tog; rep from * to marker.

Knit one round.

Dec round: *K7, k2 tog; rep from * to marker.

Knit one round.

Dec round: *K6, k2 tog; rep from * to marker.

Knit one round.

Change to double point needles as needed when decreasing.

Continue decreasing in this manner until there are 18 sts left on the needles.

Next round: *K2 tog; rep from * to marker.

Cut thread leaving approx 6". Thread a tapestry hook and thread the needle through all 9 stitches, pulling tightly. Sew in tail of yarn.

Scarf

With straight needles, cast on 28 stitches.

Row 1: K3, *p2, k2; rep from *; end p2, k3.

Row 2: P3, *k2, p2; rep from *; end k2, p3.

Repeat these two rows for desired length. Bind off all stitches in pattern. Sew in all ends.
